

AYRSHIRE

The sites on this page already appear in the Gazetteer, but in each case the trees have not been recorded since the date of the descriptions below.

Cloncaird Castle Ayrshire	The castle is now in private ownership. In 1867 a yew "situated near to Cloncaird Castle" was described, "height, 30 feet; girth at three feet from the ground, 10 feet; length of trunk, 4 feet, nine inches."
Eglinton Country Park	This country park, with free access to most areas, is in North Ayrshire. A substantial yew appears in a photo, found in an area described as 'Eglinton rockery and Lugton Water'.
Neidpath Castle,	A 14th century castle in private ownership but open to the public at certain times of the year. In 1867 there were "Twelve trees in one row in a healthy condition.supposed age 500 years; soil, very bare, about 1 foot deep." More recently it is thought that the avenue was planted in the early 17th century.
