

CAMBRIDGE

Caldecote	In 1946 Rev. T.F.Fisher described "A large yew tree." (there appear to be 2 places of this name in Cambridge)
Catworth	St Leonard's churchyard. In 1946 Rev. R.M.Tuke described "two very old yews on SW entrance."
Fleam Dyke	On the dyke between Balsham and Fulbourn the following has recently been described: "We stop to admire an ancient yew, its roots like aged tendrils gripping the manmade structure below."
Offord Cluny	In the church records: "planting of a yew tree in the churchyard (1827)."
Pampisford	St John the Baptist's churchyard. "A fairly large yew" was described in 1946 by Prof. E.H.Minns. He also observed that about half the churches in fifteen miles round Cambridge have yews.
