

<b>LANCASHIRE</b>	
Denton	A 1793 engraving of a yew, location unknown
Rivington	Terraced gardens, now in the grounds of the Anderton Conference Centre on the banks of the Lower Rivington Reservoir. "Ancient yew trees" are described.

<b>GREATER MANCHESTER</b>	
Cheadle	St Mary's: In 1686 a young yew tree planted in the east side of the churchyard near the road. In 1857 a yew was planted at the NW entrance.
Standish	A 20ft girthed yew in the rectory garden.

<b>MERSEYSIDE</b>	
Runcorn	Big Wood, situated on the NE edge of Runcorn, is designated a site of Importance for Nature Conservation. "There are a number of significant yew trees sited along ditch lines. These will need to be mapped and monitored in the years to come."
