

NORFOLK

Gunton Park	In 1841 an entry in <i>The Eastern Arboretum</i> as follows: “In front of the mansion.....in a circular space in the pleasure-ground stands a yew-tree, the finest specimen of this species we have seen in Norfolk, of which we give an etching. At one foot from the ground it measures six feet one inch in circumference, and at five feet from the ground, six feet eight inches. It is thirty-five feet high, and covers a circle of forty-five yards.
Walsingham Priory	Cornish (1946) “in the grounds of Walsingham Priory there is a sturdy yew close beside the wishing well”.
