

CEREDIGION

Aberystwyth	In <i>Sylva Florifera</i> by Henry Phillips (1823): “In the churchyard at Aberystwyth, are eleven yew-trees, the largest twenty-four feet, and the smallest eleven and a half in circumference.”
Dihewyd	No information – probably churchyard
Henfynyw	A location on the coast somewhere S of Aberaeron. A ‘church in a field’ which may now only be a ruin, is supposed to be the site of an old yew.
Llangwryfon	No information – probably churchyard
Llangybi	No information – probably churchyard
Llanwenog	No details – probably churchyard
Nantcwnlle, 8 miles N of Lampeter	1930 – “there is one yew in the graveyard which has possibly challenged the storms for many years and another which is not so old.” After the church was renovated (date unknown) about a dozen yews were planted on either side of the path from gateway to church.
Treodyraur	No information – probably churchyard
