



2007: This striking fragmented yew was brought to my attention by the Great East Devon tree hunt. It has all the hall marks of an ancient yew and grows on a mound about 10 metres from the SW corner of the church. One trunk has become completely detached from the main part of the tree. Wires help support the leaning sections. The tree has been kept low growing - a wise move since this is so close to the coast. Girth was 24' 4" close to the ground and 19' 8" excluding the detached fragment.
