

## LANARKSHIRE

The sites on this page already appear in the Gazetteer, but the trees have not been recorded since the date shown in the descriptions below.

Craignethan Castle	Craignethan castle sits on a promontory overlooking the deep gorge of the river Nethan. Its ruins are in the care of Historic Scotland. The yews are recorded as 'near the castle'. Hutchison (1890) described "3 yew trees of great age which attract the attention of all who visit the castle.....the trees stand about 15 yards apart". Girths at 3' were 10' 5", 8' 9" and 7' 9".
Townhead, North Lanarkshire	The only description is that these yews grew near the loch. They are described as "a few fine specimens of aged yew trees at Townhead." <i>Topography and Natural History of the Parish of Kilsyth 1841</i>
