Caerleon	“A yew tree marks a site overlooking the Usk” (1802). ‘Chapel Yard’ is the only clue to this location.
Llantilo	Coed Gwraig – Tal-y-coed, nr Llantilo. An ancient semi-natural woodland. ‘Yew is particularly prevalent along the sunken tracks or ditches that cross the site’. Mounton	There is a yew at each of two corners of the walled churchyard – one in the region of 18ft girth
