

2004: In 1866 a yew with a girth of 15' 4" was recorded in the Woolhope Transactions. It was almost certainly this male tree, growing SE of the church and providing shelter for a makeshift toilet. About half of the tree remained in 2004, with a girth of 8' 6". The living section of tree is seen behind the dead hollow white wood trunk of the original tree; other sections of the tree are no longer in situ. I noted that fires had been lit inside the tree's hollow.

In 2016 Paul Wood reported that the yew had fallen and demolished the shed.
