

In *The Ancient Yew* (2002) Robert Bevan-Jones devotes two pages to the *Court of the hundred yew at Churchill in Worcester*. As well as this site's importance as the location for a Court Leet, it is also on a Saxon boundary. Whether the tree dates from that time is not known, though this is undoubtedly a substantial fragment from a once much larger tree.

September 2001: Growing SW of the church is the female tree fragment with a girth of 17' 5" at the ground. It supports a thick, upright and very straight main branch, with substantial limbs either side.
