

The church lies within a raised and extended churchyard, described by the Clwyd/Powys Archaeological Trust as a 'small sub-triangular churchyard'.
1998: Of the two yews in this churchyard one is a 37' girthed fragment of a once formidable tree.



The second yew, female, grows at the boundary of churchyard and two adjacent gardens. It is seen below left in 1998, when the space between its fragments was filled with wood and other rubbish. This was gone when Edwin Pretty photographed it in 2009. It is recorded in Meredith's *Gazetteer* in *The Sacred Yew* (1994) with a girth of 22'.
