

EATON BISHOP St Michael and All Angels Diocese of Hereford SO4429839097

The church is 14th century, though this has been a site of worship since before the Norman Conquest.

The 'fine yew' was first noted in Mee's *The King's England* in about 1938.

2002: The male yew grows SE of the church, just inside the churchyard's perimeter wall. Fire in its hollow centre had damaged a large internal stem which is connected with the tree's main rising branch. This has been truncated at 25/30', probably as a result of the fire, but already new rising growth springs from around it. The unaffected part of the tree was full of vigorous growth. Girth was 19' 5" at 1' above the top of the wall.

Three further yews grow at the east end of church, the largest a male, with a girth of 13' 9" at 1' 6".
