

July 2011: Here is an ancient church, rebuilt in the 15th century. The yew grows on the north side, where its clean bole and large girth makes it a formidable presence in this churchyard. Branches have been allowed to dip to the ground where one has become embedded, while others are propped to carry them over the path. While giving the appearance of a solid tree there is a small gap at the base behind which a cavity is developing. While many brown leaves were apparent, there was also new growth all around the tree.

Girth: 16' 3" at 2'; 16' 6" at 3'; 16' 11" at 4'.
