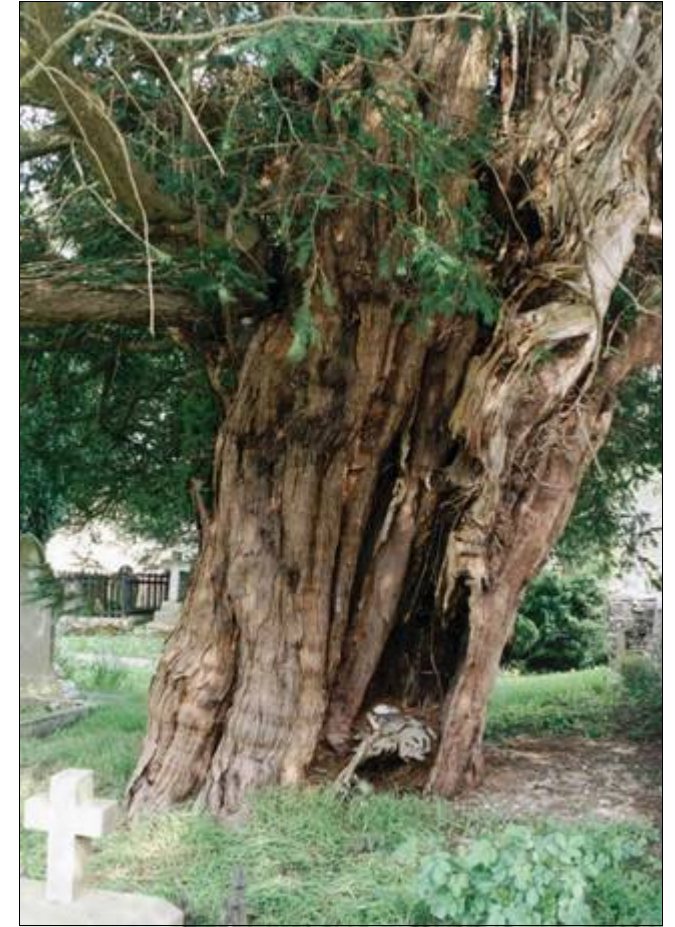


Heyope is first referred to in the St Davids' Episcopal Registers of 1398.

The site was visited in 2004 and three female yews recorded on the south side of the church. It would seem likely that they are the same age.



Above left: SSE, hollow with a narrow gap which closes over by 5'. At the time of the visit the space was filled with drying grasses from the churchyard. Its large girth of 17' 8" at 2' is retained to a height of about 20', making it a formidable presence in the churchyard.

Centre: South of the church is a walk through hollow tree standing on two 'legs'. Girth 17' 3" at 2'

Right: The tree growing SSW is smaller in girth, having lost part of its bole on the W side, exposing internal growth. Girth 14' at 2'.
