## Hampshire Yews - Hut Wood


Hut Wood was once part of the large North Stoneham Park owned by the Willis Flemings family for more than 200 years and then leased to the Forestry Commission for timber production. It was formerly part of Chilworth Forest and then carved up by the construction of the M3/M27 interchange.

Currently the public have access to the wood only because the Forestry Commission allows it, but this is a privately owned wood and access rights could change.

This short circular walk passes several fine yews, some close to the path and others well away. Summer vegetation of bracken and bramble hides many a branch and stump so care must be taken when trying to reach the trees. This article does not include all the yews to be found within this area and there are many more to find.


It is possible to park on a raised part of the old Bournemouth road B3043 just south of a large supermarket at NGR: SU427180. From here the walk takes you to the east on a wide track and the first yews are found at SU4267118519.

The most significant yews are detailed in the table on page 2. Page 3 maps the location of each yew and is followed by photos and precise locations of the 8 largest girthed yews.



