

1946: 'A few very fine yews' were reported in Cornish's *The Churchyard Yew and Immortality*.

1998: One stands out, this large male, its bole visible for half of its circumference, with internal stems seen in some of its hollows. At about 8' it divides into many growth areas, including two main branches. Many substantial lower branches have over time been removed. The wall has been well maintained, but the force of the tree's expansion is beginning once again to produce cracks. Girth was approximately 23' (measured as low as possible and through some twiggy growth).
