

Here is an isolated church in a polygonal churchyard, with a single house nearby. The church is considered to have been founded here in the 13th century.

The older yew, hemmed in by several Irish yews, grows 15 metres from the east end of the church. In 2015 it was measured at the ground on two occasions and girths of 6m and 6.20m were recorded. The discrepancy might have been the thick stems of ivy against the tree, but by 2018 when I took these photos thick twigggy growth prevented any measurement.



A second younger yew grows on the south side of the churchyard. Girth was 13' 4" at the ground in 2018.
