

An early medieval foundation is suggested for this church. In its churchyard is a large female yew that has not been allowed to grow to any great height - probably a good idea in such an exposed location. It was possible to see its vast ancient core supporting many young branches.

I recorded a girth of approximately 23' in 2007. In 2008 Russell Cleaver recorded 7.49m (24' 7") describing a 'dense, low domed tree with a reduced crown. A cramped site, the yew looks hemmed in by tombstones'.
