

This male yew grows east of the church. Its bole sweeps upwards above its cavernous hollow, with larger branches emerging from 10'/15'. The photos show that between 1999 and 2007 all lower growth was removed from the tree.

Girth was recorded by J.Daryll Evans in 1986 as 610cm (20') at 1m.

When I recorded the yew in 1999 I included the piece of stump seen at (A) in a girth of 21' 8" at the ground. Excluding this girth was 20' 8".

In 2007 I recorded girths at the ground of 21' 10" including the stump and 20' 6" excluding it.

In 2018 Peter Norton was unable to measure the yew due to low spray and encroaching ivy. It was his opinion that the stump was not part of the original yew.



There are a further four younger yews in the churchyard, one with a girth above 12' .
