

A church was reputedly established on this site in the 6th century. In *A three weeks tour into Wales 1817*, Paul Hawkins Fisher noted no fewer than 'three very aged yewtrees, the girth of one of which measured seven yards at the bottom'.

In 2005 only one aged yew remains. Today it presents as 3 substantial fragments growing on a mound at the east end of the church near to the SE corner of the building. Each fragment has a girth of about 10ft, while around all the fragments, 27ft 4in was recorded at the ground.
