



A male yew (left) grows ENE of the church by the entrance gate, its girth 16' 11" (2003) measured at the top of the wall. Foliage at that time was sparse, but was thick and healthy in 2012. Ivy was rampant and filling the tree with unnecessary extra weight. The yew is beginning to push the perimeter wall outwards.

The second yew (right) is also male and grows on the southern perimeter. It is a particularly tall tree and was also filled with ivy. Girth in 2012 was 17' 11" at 1'. Since the tree is on sloping ground this was 4' up on the bole where the ground slopes away.
