No written record has been traced, but the Nonington yew, growing SE of the church, appears in both the ink drawing created in about 1800 and the sepia print of Saunders dated 1867. (Kentarchaeology.org.uk)

2002: A female yew, whose many thick branches supported vigorous growth. Its elongated bole, with a girth of 17'1", presents two very large faces. The tree has been larger girthed, and a missing portion of the original trunk reveals internal growth at (A).
