

2016: A large female yew grows SE of the church. On the south side of the tree is a huge internal stem that has now become part of the outside of the tree. Girth of this stem was 4' 4½" using a horizontal tape from the highest ground inside the tree. There are also many smaller internal stems visible.

The tree leans slightly towards the church, but is a strong and sturdy looking specimen with many branches. Girth was 14' 5" at about 1' (above root spread). It was also 12' 4" at 3' above the tree's west side with a horizontal tape.



A yew hedge hides the oil tank and a clipped yew grows close to the dove-cote, a most unusual feature of this, or any churchyard.
