Shrivenham Beckett Park	A path known as the Haunted Walk is reported to be lined by yews.
Wittenham	Notes and Queries 1941: “The Dunch family made their home at Little Whittenham for some centuries. The mansion, which stood on the north side of the church, was pulled down at the end of the eighteenth century, but terraces and a yew walk remain, also a half-timbered barn converted into stables is close to the church.”
