



1866: A yew of 12' girth in Aston churchyard, growing in the 'hedgerow above the road', was recorded in the *Woolhope Paper*.

2003: This would seem to be the tree described in Woolhope, and if so it has grown extraordinarily quickly. It is found on the bank just outside the churchyard boundary wall. Girth at 1', or 7' above the road, was 17' 3".

Inside the churchyard are smaller girthed yews:

Furthest from the road SSW of the church with a girth of 9' 3" at 3'.

SW of the church with a girth of 13' 10" at 3'.

WSW of the church with a girth of 10' 6" at 3'.
