

2016: It was surprising to find such a fine old yew that has gone unnoticed until now. It is a hollowed out male growing only 4 metres from the south porch of the church.



Above the hollow at the height of about 6' many thick branches develop, mostly on the east side of the tree, with a single prominent branch on the west side. In the hollow could be seen several small internal stems. A large hole above the triangular shaped opening is the result of the removal of a very large branch which would have once grown towards the building. This hole will be visible until it is inevitably covered in new wood. At the time of the visit large stones were being stored beneath the tree.

Girth at the ground was more than 21'. At a narrow point below the twiggy growth and at a height of about 2', a girth of 15' 9" was recorded. At a height of about 20' could be seen another point at which the tree was probably truncated in the past, but this has long since been replaced with much new growth.
