

2007: SSW of the church (right) is a fine looking hollow yew, leaning, but with many branches reaching the ground to provide support. Tinder dry Christmas trees littered the space. As well as this fire risk the area was also used to store grass cuttings from the churchyard. Such a fine specimen deserves better. A guide to its girth is about 16'.



WSW of the church and in a more open aspect is this older looking tree. With much twiggy growth it was difficult to examine, though decay could be seen on the SW side. Girth was 16' 6" at the base.
