

The yew was first recorded in 1945, when C.J.O.Evans in *Glamorgan : Its History and Topography* described that 'a very old yew tree stands in the churchyard'.

1998: The male yew grows on a mound close to the south porch. From its short bole are 3 main growth areas, two rising and the third stretching out almost at right angles. All three support considerable branching. Girth was 24' 6" at 1'.



2017 Peter Norton took the photos below and recorded its lowest girth, at the root crown as 24' 11".
