

Not far from the church is the Holy Well, Ffynon Vair, 'to which great restorative powers are attributed'.

For his 1946 *Churchyard Yew and Immortality* Vaughan Cornish was sent information that here were '2 or 3 old yews'.

A visit in 2000 found only one to be outstanding. It is male, growing south of the church, its solid looking bole covered in ivy, upright twiggy growth, adventitious shoots and low branches. At a height of about 9', numerous branches break out in all directions; they appear to grow from the edges of the bole rather than the centre, suggesting a hollowing tree. This was confirmed by a large quantity of Chicken-of-the-Woods fungus. .

As can be seen clearly in the photo ivy has been allowed to grow so that it fills the topmost branches of the tree. The lateral branches were not affected and contained vigorous and healthy growth.

Girth was 20' 8" around the base, swelling to larger but unmeasurable girths at 3' and 5'.
