

2000: To the south east of this ruined church are 2 yews. The significant tree is not the good looking one but this unprepossessing fragment, just about clinging to life.

The fragment of living wood is growing over a large piece of dead sapwood. The unknown is whether it will be sufficiently strong to stand on its own once the dead material has decayed. The whole structure leans and was surrounded by and competing with elder, holly, ivy and bramble.

An attempted measurement at 3' was 14' 10". It is difficult to ascertain just how large this tree once was.
