

2003: A previously unrecorded female yew grows NE of the church. It has an elongated bole which gives it an appearance far larger than its girth of 13' 11" at 2'. Measured close to the ground and avoiding obvious bulges was 13' 4". It was remeasured in 2012 and a girth of 14' 4" at 2' was recorded. The tree consists of several areas of growth around its hollow centre. It is open on the west side, but on the east it is, for the moment, covered with old sapwood. One small hole in the sapwood enables you to see through the tree from one side to the other. It carried thick healthy foliage but had much ivy growing into its upper branches.



In 2016 three younger yews were recorded, each one incorporated into rough hedges on the western perimeter of the churchyard.
