

In 2000 I recorded a yew, WSW of the church, that had a fine looking trunk with some fluting, and a girth of 13' 8" at 2'. There was some bulging at 3' caused by branch removal and also twiggy growth at this height. Above a height of 8' were numerous branches. Unfortunately no photos were taken. When I returned in 2011, it was to find that all of the tree's major branches had been removed, as seen below.



I returned on a foggy day in 2016 and the tree continues to recovery. More of its twiggy branches were alive than dead, with green foliage on the west side, while on the south side foliage was a more rusty green/brown colour. Some new growth was springing from the trunk on the north side. Girth still 13' 8" at 2'.
