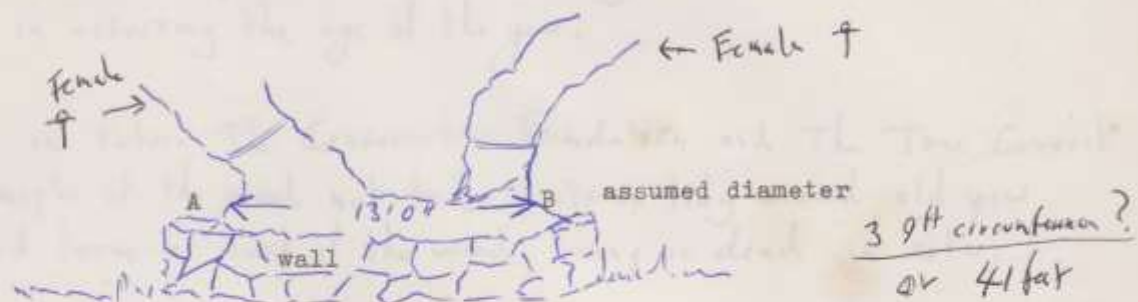
Tree (largest and oldest in Wales ?)

→ 2. east 13'9" @ 3'0" (wood sample ident 3 green bands)

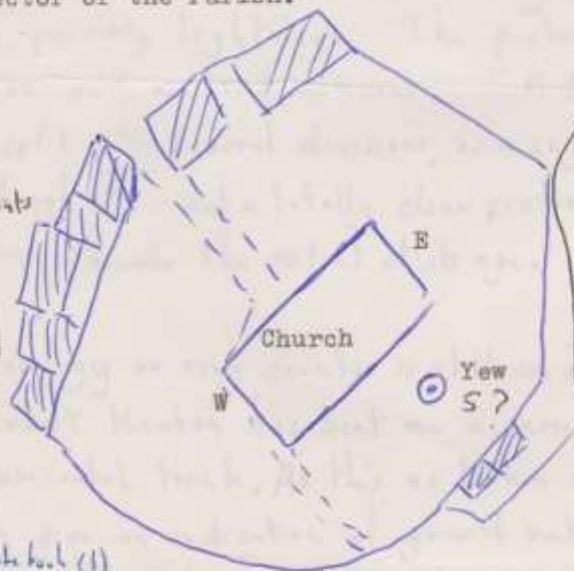
Distance A-B 13'0" above wall round root system
