As well as this large living yew, J.Daryll Evans recorded a large stump on the east margin of the church-yard in his 1988 *Churchyard Yews of Gwent*.

2002 and 2013: The male yew grows SE of the church. From its 4' bole rises a large main branch with dead remnants alongside, and a second smaller, more fragmented section. Girth in 2002 was 23' 9" at the base (over twiggy growth). The photos are from 2013.

A further 7 young yews grow in this churchyard.





2016 Paul Wood: As cars speed by in the modern world just feet away, this twisty, gnarly male yew stands guard over the old Roman Road (A40) to Brecon and central Wales. Some ivy has begun to get a foothold on this otherwise fine looking yew.
