## Hampshire Yews - Hut Wood

Hut Wood was once part of the large North Stoneham Park owned by the Willis Flemings family for more than 200 years and then leased to the Forestry Commission (FC) for timber production. It was formerly part of Chilworth Forest and then carved up by the construction of the M3/M27 interchange.


Currently the public have access to the wood only because the FC allows it, but this is a privately owned wood and access rights could change.

A small circular walk having many a fine yew along the way, some close to the path and others well away. Summer vegetation, consisting of bracken and bramble, hide many a branch and stump so care must be taken when trying to reach the trees. This article does not contain all the trees that can be found within this area so there are many more to find.

Parking can be found on a raised part of the old Bournemouth road B3043 just south of a large supermarket at NGR: <u>SU427180</u>. The walk takes you first to the east on a wide track and the first yews start at SU4267118519 the following photographs

Not all the yew discovered are listed in detail on page two, only the top few but generally all the largest are documented.

A map showing the locations is found on page three while the remaining three pages show photographic evidence of the larger yew along with a link into Street Map so as to indicate the actual location

Map of yew positions


