In 1936 two yews were recorded in Mee's The King's England.

At the time of my visit in April 2002 only one had survived, a male yew with a girth of 17' 10" at the ground, growing on a mound SW of the church.

The second yew, of similar girth to the survivor, appeared to have fallen quite recently, and a large portion of its trunk (A) lay on the ground. In falling it had brushed against the surviving tree and removed many of its branches, clearly seen in the photograph.
