



The Boningle yew is seen above in Rev. Williams 1791 watercolour and in 2012. It grows SE of a church which dates back to Norman times.

Viewed from the road the male tree appears solid, but its north side is hollow and the tree is developing a horse shoe shape. The eastern edge has considerable thickening. Girth was approximately 13' at the ground.
