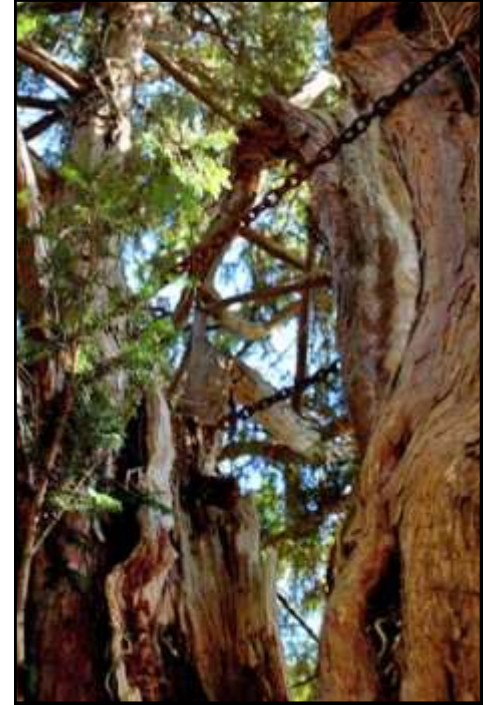


2002: I recorded a male yew with a girth of 13' 5" at 3' and a chain wrapped around the branches of a split, ivy covered tree.

In 2005 Russell Cleaver noted a part hollow, part unhealthy crown and an ivy clad stem. He recorded a girth of 12' 9" at 2'

In 2009 Peter Norton recorded that its smallest girth was 12' at 1' from the top of the slope, a height where four nails were embedded. Also 12' 7" at 3'. His photos show that the ivy had been removed.



Revisiting in 2020 Peter Norton observed some bronzing on the foliage that hangs close to the road. Also that one of the two main leaders had been truncated, but it was not clear whether this was old surgery. The tree was otherwise looking fine.
