There has been a church on this site since late Saxon times. Fareham's ancient male yew, whose girth is once thought to have been above 24', grows NE of the church. In 2015 the tree no longer fits earlier descriptions of 'a hollow tree', since sections of old sapwood that once completed the circle have now disappeared, leaving two fragments. Each of these has the potential to develop into a new tree.
