2001 Tim Hills: The significant yew here, marked V on Paul Wood's plan, grows south of the church at the edge of a steep drop above a stream. Trees 2 and 3 are younger yews, while tree 4 grows in the garden of an adjacent house.





The main growth from a featureless bole is carried upwards on two large branches, while another stretches towards the stream. Low branches had been cut off and there was much live and dead twiggy growth, as well as new wood being laid down around old decaying areas. Girth close to the ground through twiggy growth was 18' 7". Without this girth would probably be closer to 17' 6".
