

'A fine yew tree flourishes on the south side of the enclosure, having a girth of 15ft at a yard above the ground'. *Hist. Dioc. St.Asaph* (Thomas), 1909.ii.153; Glynne 'Notes,' *Arch. Camb.*, 1884,V,I,270.

2004: Since then a 3' high wall has been constructed around the tree, a hollowed out male with a richly coloured bark. On one side it has been truncated at a height of about 10' and on the other at about 14'. From here branches are largely horizontal. Girth: 15' 5" at the ground.
