

2001: This yew, which grows NE of the church, has been almost colonised by ivy. It consists of three thick branches which develop from a 2' bole. Many holes in each of these branches are evidence of the systematic removal of smaller growth.

Girth at the ground is affected by the rampant ivy, and 20' 6" can only be an approximation.



In 2005 Russell Cleaver described a 'short, squat bole, full crown from 4 leaders. Base overgrown by ivy. Female tree, just north of church'.
