


A hill top site with a church of Norman origin. The yew grows on the north side of the church.

No historical record of this yew has been found and it was first reported to us by Steven Falk in 2007. He recorded a girth of 560cm (18' 4") around its solid lower trunk.


In 2015 I recorded a girth of 18' 91/2" (573cm) keeping the tape close to the ground but above the most obvious roots. The bole divides into numerous branches from a metre and above, with many branches rising both from the edge and centre of the tree.
