In 1946 The Churchyard Yew and Immortality was published. Its author, Vaughan Cornish, had his request for information answered by Rev B.Scholfield, who described this tree as 'an old yew held together by a chain'. He also gave it a girth of 16' above root spread.

2002: At the time of my visit it was difficult to fully appreciate a yew that was lost in a thicket of well established elder. It appeared to be on a mound enclosed by a low stone wall. The female tree develops from a tall main stem, with a second of dead wood rising alongside it to a height of about 18'. These two are connected to a height of 6/7'. The chain was still in place. I recorded a girth of 15' 2" at 3'.
