


2014: The significant yew in this churchyard grows NE of the church. Its original base is hidden inside a steep mound. There is a central space 2' above the top of the mound around which grow numerous thick old branches. Girth was 24' 3" at the ground.









A second large yew once grew nearby, close to the Bonsall graves. In 1903 it measured 'over five yards' round. I am informed that it was felled in 1970 and now all that remains is this stump.



There was also once an avenue of yews leading to the south door, described as early as 1810. Only two younger yews are now seen in this position, presumably planted after the avenue was removed.
