The 1909 Little Guides to Monmouth recorded 'some fine old yew trees much decayed'. In 1986 Revd J.Daryll Evans in *The Churchyard Yews of Gwent* noted '4 large stumps of yew to the north of the church'.


The only large yew still growing here is this tall elegant female ESE of the church. A substantial internal stem fills part of its hollow. Foliage was a healthy green with plentiful new leaf growth. The photos show how quickly ivy can cover a tree if left unchecked.

In 2000 I recorded girths of 23' 3" at 3' and 22' 0" at 5'.

In 2017 Peter Norton measured at a height of about 4' 6" where some nails had been unnecessarily hammered into the tree. He recorded a girth of 22' 4".
