2004: This three trunked yew grows on a mound south west of the church. Two of these are cylindrical, while the largest, seen here on the right, is a hollowed out fragment. Ivy filled the tree to its top most branches and in the centre was a pile of dead and decaying grasses.

Girth was 24' 11" around all 3 trunks as close to the ground as possible and 13' 10" around the largest fragment at about 2' above the pile of grass.
