2004: South of the church on sloping ground is a female yew with strikingly red bark. A long narrow gash down the side facing the path reveals it to be hollow. An elongated bole means it presents two massive faces that make it appear larger than its girth of 16' 11" at 3'. Its roots spread so far at the ground that a girth recorded at 1' would be over 21'.



Next largest is a hollow male with 2 main branches from about 6'. Its hollow was part filled with red heartwood. Girth 14' 2" at 3'.

Smaller yews are found in the NE corner where a male and female grow side by side, the female with a very red trunk and girthing 11' 3" at 1'. The male, with a truncated top, is closer to the church of the two and girthed 12' 6" at 6".
