




2015: This location is not named on the Ordnance Survey 50000 map or on SatNavs. Two of the three yews at the site are noteworthy, the largest growing SW, the second S, while a smaller female yew (girth of 288 cm at the base in 2015) grows NE.

The veteran yew is male and grows close to the churchyard entrance. It has an enlarged base that exaggerates its true stature. Girth recorded in 2009 was 22' 4" at the ground. Above this swollen base is a trunk girthing about 13'.



In 2009 this yew, which grows south of the church, was recorded with a girth of 409cm at the ground. In 2015 I recorded 416cm at the ground.
