

This male yew grows SE of the church. It has split into two fragments, the smaller section pulling away from the larger and with a metal brace placed around both sections. It appeared to be serving its purpose. In 2000 the area beneath the tree was filled with decaying grasses from the churchyard, but in 2014 the ground was clear and it was possible to photograph this ancient tree.

Girth was recorded by J.Daryll Evans in 1986 as 790 cm (25' 11") at 1m. At about the same time Percy Morgan recorded 26' at 3'. I measured at the ground, allowing the tape to ride over a small section of root, and recorded 23' 7" in 2000 and 23' 11" in 2014.
